Objectives

SafeWise commissioned this second annual study to gain a deeper understanding of key safety and security issues across the US. In particular, we wanted to learn if trends spotted in the first survey held out year over year.

Take a deep dive

into attitudes, perceptions, and concerns about property and violent crime.

Understand

the means and measures people in the general population use to protect themselves and their homes.

Develop insights

into how attitudes, perceptions, and concerns differ among the population based on geography and demographics—and how those perceptions compare to actual crime trends and data.

Methodology

Timeframe

A 10-minute survey was fielded in September and October 2019.

Audiences

We surveyed 5,065 respondents across the US.

- At least 100 respondents from every state were surveyed.
- Responses were weighted based on population.

Margin of Error


Based on the number of complete responses, the study has a margin of error of $\pm 1.4\%$.

To qualify for this study, respondents had to meet the following criteria:





Executive Summary

SafeWise conducted the **second annual State of Safety survey** to find out what people are worrying about and the level of concern that Americans have for specific violent and property crime issues. We surveyed **over 5,000 individuals from all 50 states**.

To get a deeper picture of people's perceptions of crime and safety, we asked **which crimes people think are most likely to happen** and **what types of precautions** people are taking.

We also wanted to know about **personal experience with crime**. In addition to asking about experience with violent crime and property crime, our 2020 survey also asked about experience with mass shootings.

The research reveals that many trends discovered in our 2019 survey hold out year over year, despite **general levels of concern decreasing**.

Most Americans believe that crime is increasing—and nearly half of all Americans are concerned about their safety on a daily basis.

Overall Findings

Daily concern about safety and security **decreased by 21%** year over year, but experience with crime increased.

- Four-in-ten respondents said they are most concerned about property crime.
- One-in-four respondents have personally experienced (or know someone who has experienced) a property crime in the past 12 months.
- Property and violent crime are more top-of-mind among women, while men mention cybersecurity and financial security more frequently.
- Women, urbanites, households with children, people aged 18 to 34, and those who live in the southern US express the highest levels of concern among all Americans.
- Renters and those with incomes under \$50,000 also reported higher levels of concern.

Violent Crime Findings

Physical assault by a stranger is the most concerning violent crime, followed by **being robbed on the street** and **mass shootings**. These are also the violent crimes respondents feel they are most likely to be a victim of.

- Violent crime is less top-of-mind than property crime when asked about general safety concerns.
- People are most afraid of violent crimes committed by strangers.
- Murder and gun-related violence are mentioned most often in response to open-ended questions about violent crime fears.
- Women, urbanites, those aged 18 to 34, households with children, and those with incomes under \$100,000 are the most concerned about violent crime.
- Over one-in-ten respondents have experienced (or know someone who has experienced) a violent crime in the past 12 months.
- 7% of respondents have personally been (or know someone who has been) affected by a mass shooting at some point in their lifetime.
- 20% of respondents feel they are likely to be a victim of a mass shooting.
- Urbanites, those under 55 years old, and people who use personal protection report significantly higher rates of experience with mass shootings.
- Shootings in general are more concerning overall than mass shootings or random shootings in public areas.

“Shootings [are] the number one violent crime I think about...these shootings in public events places like malls, grocery stores, schools and concerts...makes me not want to attend anything anymore.”

State Differences

Those who **live in the South** have both higher concern about and a greater perceived likelihood of being a victim of violent crime.

More people in the South reported **carrying personal protection** “most of the time” than any other region.

Some states showed higher rates of concern in multiple areas of each violent crime.

- **Sexual assault:** California, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, North Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia
- **Murder:** California, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico, North Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia
- **Physical assault:** California, Florida, Louisiana, North Carolina, and Tennessee
- **Mass shootings or terrorism:** California, Florida, Maryland, Mississippi, New York, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia

Property Crime Findings

Break-ins are the most concerning property crime and they are also the crimes respondents feel are most likely to actually happen.

- Women, urbanites, and those with household incomes of less than \$150,000 are most worried about property crime.
- Nearly four-in-ten respondents think they are likely to be a victim of a break-in while not at home.
- Vehicle break-ins, property damage, vandalism, and package theft are also top property crime concerns.
- Concern about violent property crimes is also mentioned, specifically armed burglary, threats to family safety, and living in an unsafe neighborhood.
- One-in-four respondents reported a personal experience with property crime in the past 12 months.
- Women and urbanites are more likely to have experienced property crime in the past 12 months.
- Those who've experienced a property crime in the past 12 months are significantly more likely to use some kind of extra security measure to protect their home.

“Break-ins. With the increasing rate of homes having home security, people are finding new, violent ways to get what they want.”

State Differences

There are few regional differences in concern about and perceived likelihood of property crime.

Residents in the northeastern US are **less likely** to have experienced property crime in the past 12 months compared to other regions.

Experience with property crime in the past 12 months is **above average** in Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, California, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, New Mexico, North Dakota, and South Carolina.

Some states showed higher rates of concern in multiple areas of each property crime.

- **Theft:** Alabama, California, Connecticut, Hawaii, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Utah
- **Break-ins:** Alabama, California, Louisiana, Mississippi, Nevada, North Carolina, and Tennessee
- **Vehicle property crimes:** Alabama, California, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, New Mexico, Ohio, and Texas

Precautions

Almost **one-in-four respondents use a home security system** to help protect their property—that lines up with the number who reported experience with property crime in the past 12 months. Fewer than **two-in-ten respondents use some form of personal protection** most of the time.

- Insurance is the most common precaution people take to protect against a potential loss.
- Most security measures used by respondents are reactive instead of proactive.
- Households with kids, homeowners, and those with incomes under \$50,000 tend to use more security measures than other groups.
- People who've experienced a violent crime in the past 12 months are significantly more likely to carry or use some form of personal protection.
- Knives are the most used type of personal protection, followed by pepper spray and concealed firearms.
- Men are significantly more likely to carry personal protection, especially knives and concealed firearms.
- Women are more likely to use pepper spray, rape whistles, and keychain weapons.
- Home security is more top-of-mind for those aged 18 to 34 than any other age group.
- Monitored security systems are used far more often than self-monitored security systems, but women are more likely to self-monitor than men.
- Dogs or other guard animals are the most common security measure used to protect property, followed by firearms, security cameras, and security systems.
- Nearly three-in-ten respondents don't use any extra measures to protect their property.

Media Consumption

We wanted to see if there's a **correlation between news consumption** and **levels of concern** about safety, particularly as related to social media and other nontraditional news sources.

- Despite the digital era, most people still get their news from TV.
- Seven-in-ten respondents tune in to TV broadcasts to get their news.
- Less than half of respondents report using social media or websites for news.
- Women, urbanites, and people under 55 years old are more likely to get news from social media. Those are also among the groups most highly concerned about safety across the board.
- Men are taking in more news than women. Significantly more males report consuming five or more hours of news per week.
- Print media, news apps, and radio or podcasts are less common news sources, with fewer than one-in-three respondents consuming each.

In Conclusion

The research reveals that **gaps between perception and reality** in regard to key safety and crime issues **persist year over year**. While reported levels of concern decreased between 2019 and 2020, overall reports of personal experience with crime increased.

Sentiment that **crime is rising across the country** was profound—despite two decades of decreasing crime rates in the US. Violent crimes committed by strangers remained the most concerning, yet more violent crimes are carried out by perpetrators known to the victim.

Despite high levels of experience with crime and the perception of climbing crime rates, nearly **three-in-ten** Americans use **no security measures** to protect themselves or their property. Those who use security measures opt for reactive measures (knives, firearms, guard dogs, pepper spray) over proactive measures (security cameras, security systems, self-defense classes).


There was **no obvious link** between **news consumption** and **high levels of concern** about safety and crime. Women were consistently more concerned than men and they reported more use of social media; however, men consumed more news overall than women.













Overall Safety & Security Concern

As seen in 2019, property crime persists as the most top-of-mind safety concern, with home break-ins and theft specifically mentioned most often. Vehicle theft and break-ins are also common concerns.

Violent crime is the second-most mentioned safety concern, with shootings, neighborhood crime, and the proliferation of guns and other weapons cited most often.

Last year, digital security was another top-of-mind concern, and it remains worrisome in 2020 along with personal and family security, government policies, road safety, and environmental issues.

Concerns with Violent Crimes

When it comes to violent crime, **murder/homicide** is top-of-mind among Americans, followed by **aggravated robbery and assault/battery**.

- **Shootings** and murder are frequently mentioned, yet **mass shootings/random shooting in public areas** are a lower concern when thinking of violent crime.
- While **robbery and theft** are most commonly mentioned in a general sense, **muggings, vehicle carjacking, and armed robbery are mentioned**.

Following these violent crimes, **organized crimes** (such as drug related violence) and **sexual assault** (such as rape) are frequently mentioned concerns.

Concerns with Property Crimes

Break-ins and home invasions are the most frequently mentioned property crime, followed by **theft / robberies**.

- Other property crime concerns include **vehicle break-ins** and **property damage/vandalism**.
- To a lesser degree, other mentions of property crime concerns include: theft of home deliveries, garage break-ins, vehicle damage, arson/house fires, and armed burglary.

Following property crimes which result in loss or damage to personal property, **violent property crimes** are mentioned, such as **threats to family safety** or **living in an unsafe neighborhood**.
